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PREFACE

This is the tenth report in the series of the Annual Employment Survey. The first was conducted by this Department in the year 1971 under an UNDP / ILO Project for the development of Labour Statistics. The detailed statistics presented in the tables in the appendix and summarised in the text are in respect of those responding establishments having 5 or more paid employees and engaged in productive, distributive business and commercial activities in both the private and public sectors. A very large number of establishments were addressed (round about 15,000) but the problem of non response has been increasing year by year. The special tables analysis of women's employment are also being continued as there are several organisations interested in obtaining this data. The index number of employment series with 1971 as base is an indicator of the trends in employment from year to year.

New establishments coming into the purview of the survey are obtained from the records of the Employees Provident Fund and from other sources such as the Ministry of Industries the Industrial Development Board etc. but the one sure way of obtaining a comprehensive list is to conduct a Census of Business Establishments.

I wish to thank the managements and their representatives both in the private and public sector enterprises who responded to our questionnaire. My thanks are also due to the Data Processing Division of the Department of Census & Statistics who were responsible for the machining of the data and all officers of the Statistics Branch both Programming Assistants and clerical staff who contributed in no small measure in bringing out this report.

Mrs. G.S.Rathnayake, Statistical Officer incharge of the Employment Survey Unit was responsible for all the aspects of the Survey and with her staff for bringing out the detailed tables under the guidance of the Labour Statistician Mr. L.D.Mylvaganam who also wrote the text of this report.

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Labour initiated an annual series of Employment Surveys in 1971. The objectives of this series of surveys are, firstly to provide on a regular annual basis statistics relating to employment in the organised or modern sector of the country's economy and secondly to enable the Department to maintain and update the up to date list of establishments in this sector (farm) on which sample surveys relating to other characteristics of the sector could be based. The survey thus covers (I) establishments (other than estates) employing five or more paid employees (II) tea estates of 25 or more acres employing 5 or more paid employees and (III) rubber and coconut estates of 50 or more acres employing 5 or more paid employees. The employment data for which the reference date is the last full working day of the month of June is collected from establishments by means of a mailed questionnaire. For detailed discussion of the scope & coverage of the survey & survey techniques see report for year 1971. This report presents the results of the 1980 survey which is the 10th in the series.

Table 1 gives the analysis of response in the 1980 survey 13,177 establishments in the private and public sectors were canvassed. Of this 1735 establishments fell outside the scope of the survey. The number of eligible establishments was 11,442 but of this only 8256 responded to the questionnaire which gives a non response rate of 27.8%. Although absolute number of establishments has been of a high order the number of employees covered in the survey has only dropped by 2%. This shows that the non response has been from the smaller establishments and this is confirmed by the figures in table 4 which gives a comparative study of common establishments for two consecutive years. However this should not detract from the fact that the problem of non response has now reached alarming

The present method adopted is for reminders to be sent to all non response institutions and officers from the branch being sent to a limited number of institutions to collect these schedules during one month of the year. Unless these personal visits by the office-contd. staff is extended to cover more establishments there does not appear to be any other persuasive way of reducing this factor of non response. Legal remedies are of course available but putting this to operation would be a very long and tedious process. But it would be worthwhile if a few non-responding establishments are prosecuted so that it would serve as a deterrent to all other establishments falling into this category.

TRENDS IN EMPLOYMENT

Table 2 shows the number of establishments submitting returns & employment therein.

Even a superficial look at this table would show that there has been a significant drop in the number employed. This is not due to the fact that there has been no employment generated during the year 1980 as compared with 1979 but merely that due to the large non response there is this apparent drop. This table should be read along with the figures and analytical notes on table 3&4 for a better study of trends. It is proposed in this report to once again explain the method of the computation of the employment index numbers.

INDEX NUMBERS OF EMPLOYMENT - Index numbers have been generally accepted as the best indicator of trends not only in the employment field but in other sectors of economic activities as well. While in most fields it is possible to have a common set of comparable components it is not possible in a survey of this nature to obtain a fixed list of common establishments from year to year. Once again the problem of non-response is a serious factor when dealing with such large numbers of establishments.

The figures of total employment obtained from the survey relate to establishments submitting returns and since the response varies from year to year the figures do not reflect the trends correctly. Further there have been changes in the frame due to inclusion of establishments earlier missed, removal of duplicates, changes of ownership from private to public sector or vice versa of establishments, reclassification of industries, re-delineation of establishments and so on. All these factors disturb the comparability of figures from year to year and vitiate the trends. Normally this situation is used in the initial years of a survey when conditions have not yet reduced any stability but in this particular survey with non-response rates increasing from year to year it may not be possible even to make direct comparisons of any two years. Therefore under these conditions trends from one year to another can best be studied by first comparing employment in common establishments between two adjacent years. This method would reduce the effect of the changes in the frame etc. For example taking years 1971 and 1972, the common establishments

excluding those which reported for 1972 but not for 1971 and also those for which figures for the two years were not comparable for some reason or the other, can be picked out industry by industry and the employment in such common establishments added up for 1971 as well as for 1972. These two sets of figures industry wise will be comparable and will reflect changes in employment unaffected by extraneous factors between two years.

The changes in employment can be best understood by reducing these absolute figures in terms of index numbers with a fixed base. The figure of 1972 relating to common establishments can be expressed as a percentage of the corresponding employment in 1971 to derive the employment index number for 1972 on base 1971 = 100.

In the next step years 1972 and 1973 can be compared in the same manner and another set of employment indices for 1973 with base 1972 = 100 constructed. Multiplying the index numbers for 1973 on base 1972 = 100 by the index number for 1972 with base 1971 = 100 and dividing by 100 it is possible to have index numbers for 1973 on base 1971 = 100. This is known as the link relative method by which successive links can be multiplied and converted into indices with a fixed base. Similarly the index numbers of employment for 1980 are expressed as a percentage of the corresponding employment for 1979 and then linked to base 1971 = 100. In this method the trends of employment from private to public sector or from one industry to another or varying coverage from one year to another which are not real changes in employment.

Now looking into the figures in Table 3 it will be observed that the 'All industries' employment index for 1980 is 115.0 almost the same as in 1979. Infact there has been a slight drop of 0.7%. However this should actually be not considered as an actual drop in employment because there has been a high degree of non response all round and the number of employees covered in the exercise (taking only common establishments) has dropped by 0.6%. Apparently there has been some sort of deceleration in employment generation in 1980. The Central Bank report for the year 1980 confirms this phenomenon. A more detailed look into the index numbers of the major industry divisions shows a drop of 0.9% in the Agricultural sector (by far the largest employment-wise) while there has also been a drop registered in the 'Transport, Financig, Insurance & Business services' Community Social & Personal Services and in the smaller sectors 'Mining and Quarrying and Electricity Gas & Water'. Manufacturing shows a 1.5% rise, Construction a 5%rise and 'Wholesale, Retail, Hotel & Restaurants a 6.7% increase. Conditions prevailing in 1980 tend to bear out these trends as other reports on the economy during this period also indicate.

This survey does not claim to cover 100% of the organised establishments but about 80% of the so called organised can be deemed to have been covered or nearly 1/3 of the total employed population. Various factors such as repatriation has been responsible for the decrease in the agriculture sector while a fairly significant exodus of employees in the C.T.B who opted to retire could have covered the drop in Transport divisions. Therefore the conclusion that employment generation was almost stagnant in 1980 is not very far from true. Once again it is necessary to reiterate the fact that this is purely an establishment wise survey and confined to only establishments having 5 or more paid employees in the private sector and to certain Government Departments in the public sector which come within the purview the survey and all public corporations. So the unorganised sector, self employed persons and the 'Service' category of Government Departments are not included in the survey.

The Table 4 above is also a detailed analysis of the trends for 1980 as compared with 1979. As mentioned earlier these figures have been used in the first stage computation of index numbers. Since common establishments have been compared increases or decreases are uncontaminated by other factors such as changes in the frame as mentioned earlier.

In the plantation sector drops have been registered in the Tea and Coconut cultivation industry. With the introduction of planting subsidies and generally Rubber Workers have always been paid higher wages than the Tea estate workers. This could be reason for the employment rise in the Rubber Estates. On the other hand coconut estates are also benefited by subsidies but still show a drop in employment. One fact must however be mentioned. As opposed to Tea and to a certain extent in Rubber, employment in the coconut industry is mostly confined to non-residential labour ie fed by labour from the surrounding villages. Also coconut cultivation does not require a permanent labour force, mostly casual labour is employed as and when required. As such some of this data may have not been included in the returns submitted by the coconut estate managements. It is of course not possible to include casual employees especially those engaged only for a specific job as part and parcel of the estate / establishment concerned. However daily paid employees who work on a regular basis and who are also termed as 'casual' should be included in the return. In the manufacturing industry the increase has been more significant in the Textile and Weaving apparel industry which is as it should be since the Garment industry has expanded by leaps and bounds during the past few years. Machinery and equipment also had a sizeable increase while the other smaller manufacturing industries registered a drop.

The retail trade industry, a part of the industry group 'Wholesale and Retail trade, Restaurants & Hotels showed a rise of 9.7% over 1979 although the other components of the group showed decreases. The 'Hotel Industry' no doubt has lost a large number of its employees for the more attractive remuneration offered by the Hotels in Middle East. So it is more than a possibility that this is a major reason for the decline in employment. This is understood by the fact that the news papers are full of advertisements for vacancies existing in this field in this country. Table 4 itself is self-explanatory and it is really not very necessary to go into a critical analysis of the table. The public sector & private sectors have both been analysed separately in addition to the Combined sector data.

DISTRIBUTION OF EMPLOYMENT - The tables 5, 6 & 7 give in a summarised form the distribution of employment according to major industrial division and sector, major occupational categories & sector and the percentage distribution of employees by age, sex & sector respectively. Percentages have been given instead of absolute figures. There have been no shifts in the composition of each major industry group. Agriculture (Plantation) absorbed 50% of the employees enumerated in the survey. Manufacturing 17% came next while Wholesale & Retail trade, restaurants & hotels with 9% came third with construction. This has been the pattern over the years confirming the fact that agriculture has been and will be the leading sector of employment for a long

In table 6 (the occupational distribution of employees) there does not appear to be any change in the distribution. Unskilled workers mostly in the Agriculture sector comprise 60% of the employees enumerated while the skilled and semi skilled category is far second at 20% with the clerical group further down at 9%. This has been the pattern for sometime now. Production and related workers (ie those in the lower rungs of the occupational scale) occupy 83% of the occupations a sign of a still developing economy.

Table 7 - gives the percentage of male employees and female employees according to sectors. Here too there are no changes in the proportions in 1980 over 1979 nor has there been any over the last few years. However there has been a 1% increase in the number of women employees in 1980 over 1979. According to the latest population data for 1981 the percentage of males to females in the age group 15 - 54 years has been 54.9% and 55.7% respectively. This shows that there are slightly more females than males in the normal working age group. Although this is the population ratio the employed ratio is 66:34 or to put it fraction wise 2/3 : 1/3. Therefore it is not surprising that there is a glamour for equal opportunities for women in employment.

EMPLOYMENT OF WOMEN IN INDUSTRIES - The Table 8 above shows the percentage of women employees to the total number of employees enumerated both men and women.

Since 1975 there has been a slight drop in the 'Agriculture sector' over the years. This sector comprises most of women workers. Repatriation over the years no doubt has been the factor responsible while there has been a very small shift from agriculture to the more sophisticated sectors of the industry. Women leaving the country for a better remunerative package in the Middle East will only be reflected to a small degree in these tables as most of female exodus has been from the unemployed or the domestic service sector.

while the balance were in mostly Rubber & Coconut cultivations in the unskilled grades. This proportion has been closely followed over the years. The manufacturing which is of next importance where women employment is concerned showed a drop from in 1979 compared to 55,690 in 1980. There is a possibility that some of these in this sector have left the country for jobs abroad. 'Wholesale & Retail trade', Restaurants & Hotels' comes a far third although actual figures (18,038) shows a decline compared to 1979 (20,921) and 22,978 in 1978. Small increase have been registered over 1979 in the construction, Financing & Personal services industry. The textile industry which also employs a fair percentage of women (22,897) showed a decline as compared to 1979, this most probably due to the closure of several handloom centres in the island. On the other hand the 'garment' industry which is an ever expanding industry showed a very high increase almost over 200% due to several new export manufacturing establishments, being opened in the Free Trade Zone. Of the 18,038 female employees in the major industry group 'wholesale & retail trade inc. Restaurants & Hotel 13,588 were in the retail trade mostly comprising employees in multi-purpose cooperatives. This is a slight increase over 1979 although the overall industry group showed a slight decline.

Table 9 shows the breakdown of women employees in 1980 according to major occupational categories. The lowest rung namely the unskilled workers comprise nearly 73% of the women employed. These are mostly pluckers and tappers in the Tea & Rubber cultivations reporting. The next largest group can be found in the skilled and semiskilled categories with 57,707 workers. An increase of nearly 300 workers most employed in the skilled category in the garment industry of the Free Trade Zone. in the foremen & supervisory category too there has been an increase over 1979 from 2640 to 3640. These increases have been registered in all major industry groups ie.

over 1/3 of the women employed are skilled workers. Sales workers comprise 36.9% in this category. In the Trade and Hotel industry 32.1% are clerical workers and 21.3% are sales workers while in the other industry groups 'female clerical workers' cover 19.3% while 'professional, technical & related workers' 15% and foreman and supervisor category 13%.

TABLE 11 - This is a new table introduced this year in order to show the percentages of women employees to the total women employees enumerated. The earlier tables 8,9 & 10 presented percentages of women employed in the breakdowns to the total number of employees both men and women.

This table clearly indicates the industry the industry and occupations where women are mostly concentrated. Of the total number of women enumerated (363,018) 263,949 or 72.7% are in Agriculture (mostly plantations) and of this 91% are in the unskilled category while in the manufacturing sector 62% of the women are skilled or semiskilled while 26% are skilled. In the Trade & Hotel category women are predominant in the sales and clerical categories while in all other industry groups combined women were mostly engaged in clerical duties and in the unskilled category.

TABLE 10 - Table 10 gives an analysis of the number and percentage of women employees of selected major industry division and major occupational categories.

The figures here bear testimony to the fact that women are mostly still in the lower rung of the occupation scale and confined mostly to the agricultural sector (Estates). Of the total number of men and women workers enumerated 263,949 fell into the category 'Agriculture, Forestry & Fishing'. Fifty one percent (51%) were unskilled while 30% were in the Professional, Technical & related worker category. This may appear to be very difficult to understand but a scrutiny of the type of persons who have entered this category will show that midwives and teachers on estates have been included here as required by the standard occupational classification. In the manufacturing sector of the total employed 37.6% are women in the skilled and semi skilled category ie. a little

#### CONCLUSION

Surveys become meaningful provided there is a high degree of response. The higher the response the more accurate will be the picture. Drawing conclusions from smaller representation is susceptible to various types of error.

Therefore it is essential that there is a greater degree of follow up visits to non-responding establishments. Due to the drastic cut in the travelling allocation these follow up visits have had to be curtailed to the minimum.

Unless more stringent methods are adopted to obtain better response either (a) by prosecution atleast one or two non-responding establishments (b) or by increasing the travelling allocation for more follow up visits there is a likelihood of the non-response rate increasing to such an extent where the survey may have to be abandoned.
