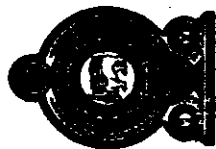

DETAILS

1. Ancillary units including administrative offices, warehouses, garages, repair shops, electric plants which primarily serve your productive establishment should be treated as part of your establishment if they are at the same site or in the same Census Bureau Division/Ward. Individual "homeworkers" are not regarded as establishments.

2. To be covered are establishments engaged in the production of one class of homogeneous goods in the fields of (a) mining and quarrying, (b) manufacturing and (c) the production and distribution of electricity, gas and water.

3. If your establishment does not maintain any book records, carefully prepared statements would be accepted. Complete every item, entering "0" where applicable. The Department of Census and Statistics' census staff will change of your area are available to assist you in completing this form.

DESCRIPTION OF ESTABLISHMENT

Physical location of establishment :- It is the actual physical location of the establishment. It is to be entered here. This may be different from the mailing address (1B).

Required to the description of your principal activity: eg. printing, rice milling, chilli milling, battery, soap making, jewellery making, etc.

Supply further information on your other activities: eg. operation of a hairdressing saloon, service garage, boutique, bicycle repair shop, sawmill and carpentry shop etc.

Mark (X) as appropriate if you are registered, for reasons connected with your business, with any government agency, kachibari, non-government organization, eg. credit society, trades or business association, etc.

The information supplied here will assist the Department of Census and Statistics in ascertaining the effects of changing seasons on industrial activity and in monitoring changes of ownership.

Describe briefly in the space provided, the principal processes (the most important sequences of operations) used in producing the goods made by this establishment. State whether machine or hand process. Here are some examples: (a) design drawing, marking and cutting of fabric (hand); (b) hand spinning (hand); (c) design drawing, marking and cutting of fabric (hand); (d) design drawing, marking and cutting of fabric (hand); (e) cutting and sewing of garments (machine); (f) design drawing, marking and cutting of fabric (hand); (g) marking and cleaning of rice (machine).

EMPLOYERS' EMPLOYER

Number of Persons Employed, includes :-

Working Prepaiders and Active Partners and similar persons who are actively engaged in the work of this establishment.

Unpaid Family Workers: all persons living in the household of any of the owners and working in the establishment without regular pay for at least one third of the normal working time of the establishment during the period. Non-household members who do not work for pay may also be included here.

All persons working in this establishment and receiving pay as well as persons working away from the establishment when paid by and under the control of the establishment (except homeworkers). Included are all workers whether full-time or part-time not excepting those on sick leave, paid vacation or holidays.

Supply figures only if "homeworkers" are important in your business. The term "homeworkers" is defined as all persons employed by your establishment, in general on a piece-work basis, who work in their own home with material supplied by your establishment, who are paid by your establishment. This kind of operation is known to be common in the textile and handloom industries. Homeworkers paid by sub-contractors are not included.
